

CAPACITY BUILDING OF SENIOR LIBYAN EDUCATORS IN SINGAPORE



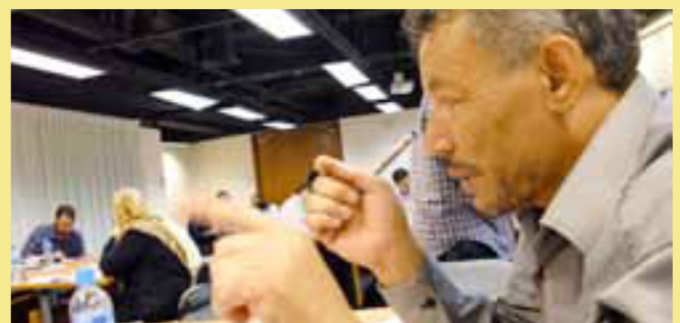

A group of 49 senior educators from Libya have been undergoing teacher training in Singapore since April 2010. The participants are either headmasters or subject specialists – teachers or education inspectors – in mathematics or science. This programme is jointly conducted by Educare and NUS Extension. The Libyan participants have already attended a two-month English language bridging course at NUS Extension. Educare is now focusing on pedagogy training with a variety of focus areas including Basic ICT Skills, Cooperative Learning, Critical Thinking, Assessment in the 21st Century Classroom and Creativity and Innovation.

The participants will also be exposed to the Singapore education system through school visits and attachments. There will also be mentoring sessions where education officers from Educare will share their insights into the topics covered while coaching and mentoring the participants.
